 33% are members of a minority group

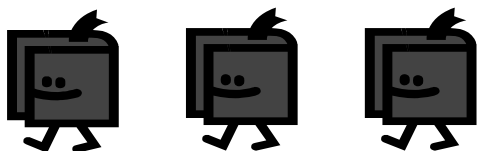
61% are White

59% of UMass Boston students are first-generation college students (neither parent graduated from college)*

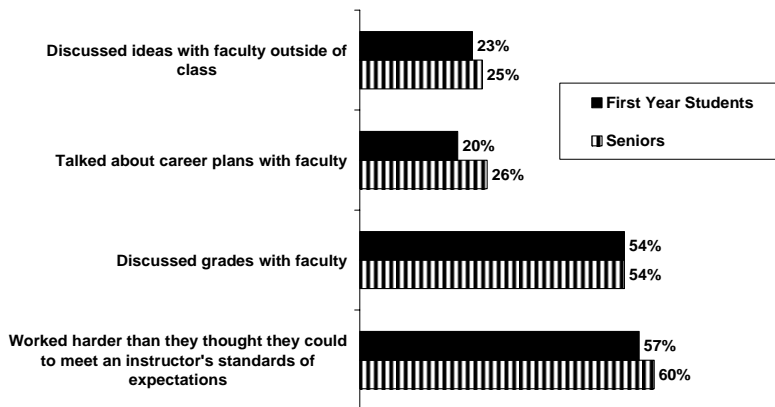
How old are UMass Boston Students?

68% of UMass Boston degree-seeking undergraduates are transfer students



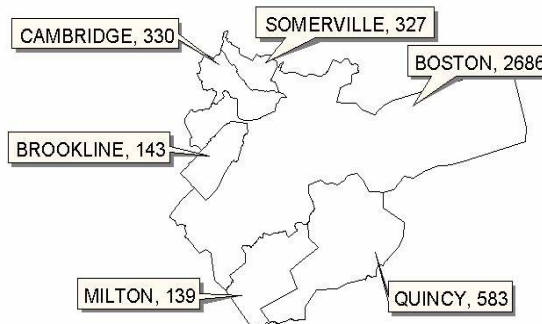
Percent of NSSE 2004 Respondents Who Reported that They "Often" or "Very Often" Did the Following

32% are first-time freshmen

Continuing Education Students: Take courses available at UMB that are not subsidized by state funds



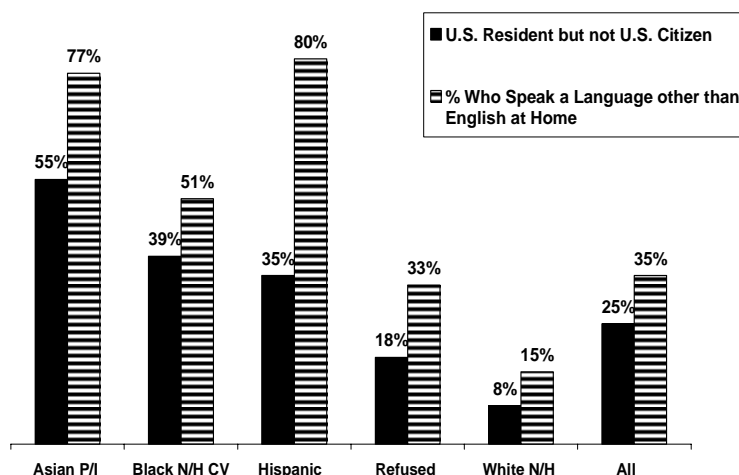
