

## ABOUT US

**UMass Boston** - The only public university in metropolitan Boston, located on Boston harbor, the Boston campus offers 81 undergraduate degree programs, 41 master's degree programs, 15 doctoral programs, and 13 undergraduate certificate programs through its seven colleges and Division of Corporate, Continuing, and Distance Education (CCDE). UMass Boston serves the most diverse student population in New England. As a key institution in Boston that sponsors 30 research centers and institutes, UMass Boston contributes substantially to public policy discussion and formulation in such areas as economic development, social well-being, environmental affairs, and health care. UMass Boston is integral to the city and its neighborhoods as it reaches out through partnerships with the Boston Public Schools, local businesses, community programs, and youth sports.

**OIRP**- The Office of Institutional Research and Policy Studies (OIRP) is responsible for reporting student, course, faculty, staff, and academic program data to state and federal agencies, and to UMass Boston faculty, students, and administrators. We also conduct surveys and complete special analyses and reports.
