 34% are members of a minority group

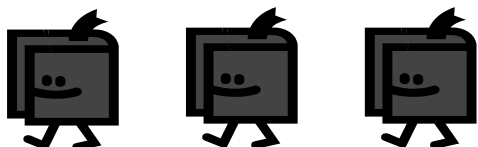
61% are White

59% of UMass Boston students are first-generation college students (neither parent graduated from college)*

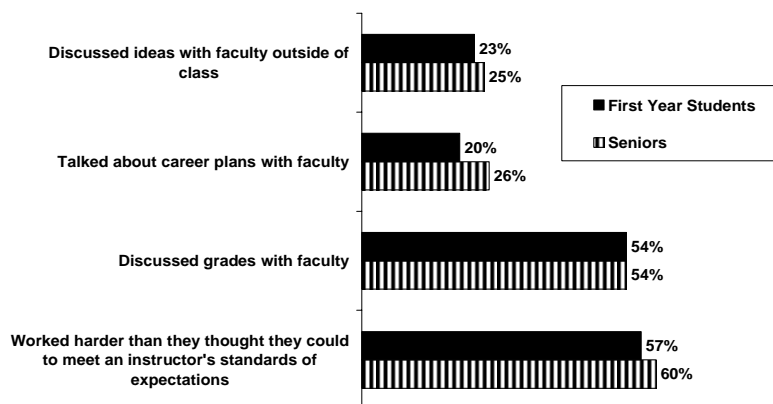
How old are UMass Boston Students?

63% of UMass Boston degree-seeking undergraduates are transfer students



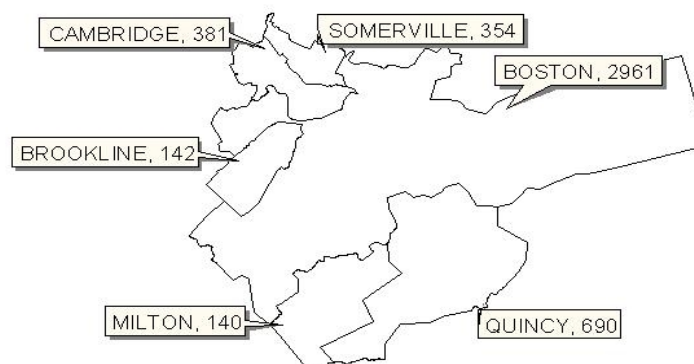
Percent of NSSE 2004 Respondents Who Reported that They "Often" or "Very Often" Did the Following

Take courses available at UMB that are not subsidized by state funds



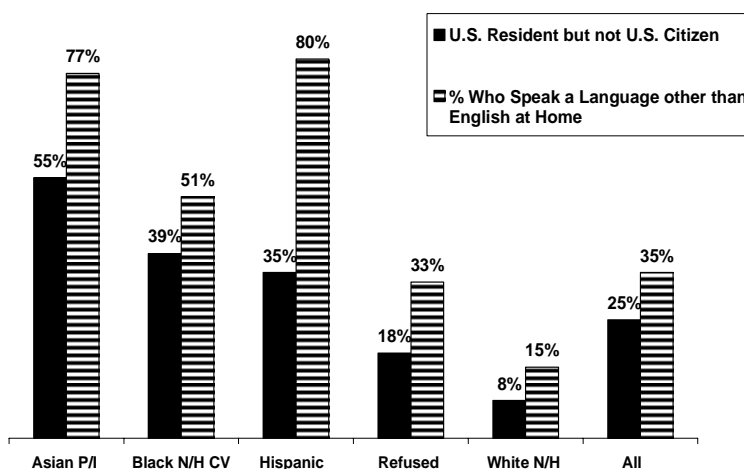

21% of students had a GPA of 3.5 or higher during the Fall 2005 term

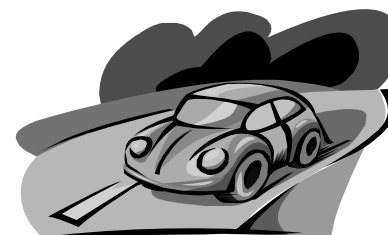
Citizenship and Language Diversity for Permanent U.S. Residents
