### Out of 12,362 students in Fall 2006...

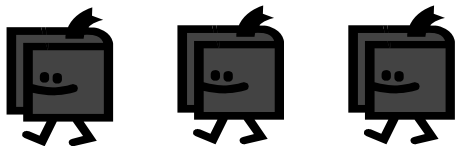
- 60% are women
- 46% attend part-time
- 75% are undergraduates
- 36% are members of a minority group
- 57% are White
- 13% are African-American
- 10% are Asian/Pacific Islander
- 7% are Hispanic
- 0.4% are Native American
- 4% are Non-Resident Alien

53% of UMass Boston students are first-generation college students (neither parent graduated from college)\*

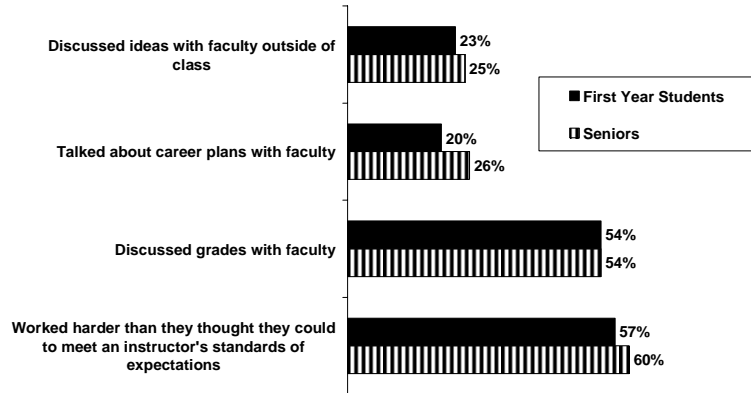
### How old are UMass Boston Students?

63% of UMass Boston degree-seeking undergraduates are transfer students



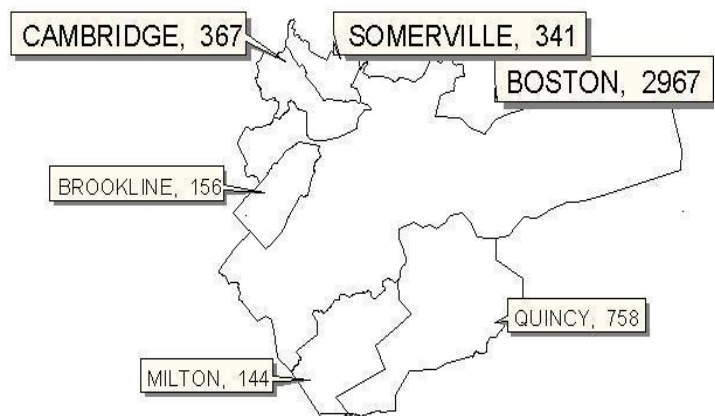
Percent of NSSE 2004 Respondents Who Reported that They "Often" or "Very Often" Did the Following



### Of 2,477 new undergraduates in Fall 2006...

- 39% are first-time freshmen
- 19% are transfers with freshmen standing
- 18% are transfers with sophomore standing
- 19% are transfers with upper-division standing
- 5% are other transfers in CPCS or special programs

**Continuing Education Students:** Take courses available at UMB that are not subsidized by state funds



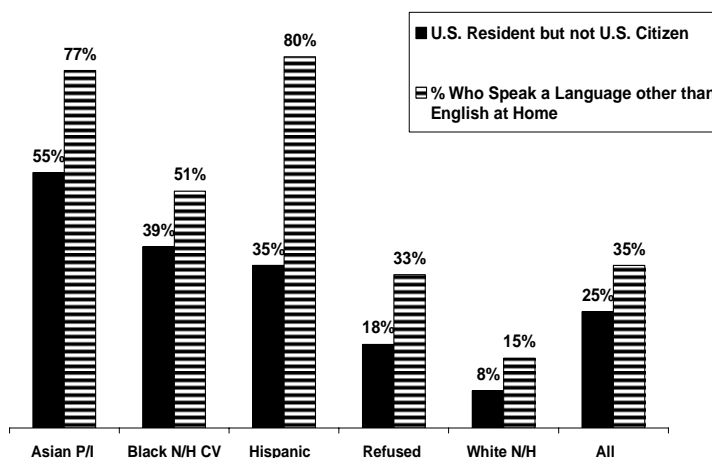

23% of students had a GPA of 3.5 or higher during the Fall 2006 term

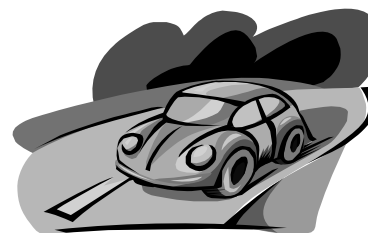
**Citizenship and Language Diversity for Permanent U.S. Residents**
